

Literacy

Focus - capital letters, full stops and writing a sentence. Middle ability children to use conjunctions and write with increasing independence. Higher ability to use higher level punctuation and to begin self and peer assessing their work and making changes to it.

Non-fiction report writing about seasonal change. Cross curricular links with Science. Poetry- seasonal poems and writing our own seasonal poem. Acrostic poetry continuing focus on seasons. A week of work on calligrams focusing on things I love.

ICT and Computing

Maths

Multiplication and Division - learn the 5 x table and how to apply knowledge to solve 1 step problems. Doubling numbers. Vocabulary to include 'greater than' and 'less than'. Fractions - finding fractions of numbers and quantities. Turning through whole, half and quarter turns and recognizing clockwise and anticlockwise movement. Begin recognising their left and right and using this language. Measures unit - measuring and comparing capacities and weight and presenting this data.

Science

Continued from Spring 1:

Children are taught to work scientifically through the topics of humans, animals and seasonal change.

Animals including humans

Find out and compare the human body with that of a wide range of animals. Children understand animal body parts.

Discover and describe pets other people have and explain how children can use their senses. Guide dogs for the blind.

Identify carnivores, omnivores and herbivores. Simple ven diagram. Identify animals found in the local environment including farm and zoo animals.

Seasonal change - also covered in Literacy through the end of Spring 1 report writing and in the seasons poetry.

Trip to local park for a seasons walk.

PE
